### S/N IMPACT OF PETSMART SALE?

"Animals 24-7" asks--What will the Dec. 2014 sale of PetSmart mean to PetSmart Charities (PSC) the affiliated nonprofit that helps to facilitate about 400,000 adoptions & about 285,000 S/N's /yr, while making about \$34 million/yr. in grants to about 2,800 other animal charities? Since PSC is separately incorporated, the PetSmart sale does not necessarily mean a transition of PSC leadership--though probably it will. ### **"FIX FELINES BY FIVE" CAMPAIGN**

www.Mariansdream.org, whose mission is to create & support programs to end pet overpopulation, celebrates the start of their new campaign & Dr. Richard Speck's , 'The Case for Neutering at Five Months of Age' (click title to access) in the Nov/Dec "Today's Veterinary Practice". "FIX FELINES BY FIVE" recognizes that most people "were not sure when" to S/N or thought pets "should be S/N'd after 6 mo. of age." (By then, litters are possible & 60% are unplanned & not wanted.) "... a Mass. survey found that female cats & dogs that had been sterilized after having at least 1 litter accounted for 87% of all litters born.... Pet population rates were not being driven by animals that would remain intact, but rather by those that would eventually be spayed." Since there is some debate re S/N'g large dogs before 6 mos, the program focuses solely on cats to "Beat the Heat" & substantially reduce unplanned unwanted litters while achieving all the additional benefits of S/N.

"The majority of presterilization litters can be eliminated by performing recommended neutering just one month earlier—at 5 months of age rather than 6 months."
